
- All assignments, quizzes, tests or projects are due ONE DAY AFTER YOUR ABSENCE. Quizzes and tests must be redone during tutorial!

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Cell phones and personal computers may be used only with teacher permission. Cell phones should not even be on your desk (because they are so tempting) without teacher permission. If you need to call a parent, or if you have a personal situation going on that requires immediate communication just let me know and I will allow you to use my phone. You may not wear headphones in my classroom unless you specifically ask and are granted permission from me.

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CONTRACT

The honors program is about challenging oneself to go above and beyond the state mandated curriculum. In an honors program the student is held to a higher standard in both the work he/she completes, and the way that student presents himself or herself. With that in mind, an honors student exhibits traits that all students should aspire to: drive, timeliness, ability to multi-task, and a healthy sense of competition and inspiration to be the best in class. The student should be reading at a high level, be able to comprehend and think critically about texts, understand the verbiage associated with reading and writing, and be willing and eager to participate in a high-level Socratic discussion about a myriad of themes and ideas. An honors student is above all mature, respectful and able to appropriately handle difficult themes and differing opinions.

RULES FOR REMAINING IN HONORS:

- Students in Honors must maintain a "C" or better each quarter. If grade gets below a "C," the student will face a review by the teacher and the building principal that may result in removal from the class
- Cheating on tests, assignments or PLAGIARISM will be cause for immediate removal from the class, and an "F" will be placed in for the final grade on that assignment
- Have zero (0) unexcused absences
- Receive an A, B, or C on all reading tests and quizzes (without retakes)
- Any discipline referrals will result in a review from the building principal.
- Have 2-3 hours of verifiable community service per trimester
- Meet proficiency on all English standards
- Have no more than one zero or late assignment per trimester

If you fail to meet the eligibility requirements, you will not earn an honors designation on your transcript and you *may* be removed from the class at any time. I have read this contract and agree to the terms listed above.
