If a household is eligible for SNAP, the household will receive a Direct Certification letter from the Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services in the mail. **This letter may be used in place of the school meals application.** 

Applications may be submitted at any time during the year. Households will be notified of eligibility determination. At any time during the school year, program officials may verify an application.
